We will have a Halloween parade/party on October 31 at half-day of school. Students will not be allowed to wear costumes home.





Here's what is happening in our class this week!

LANGUAGE ARTS:

Reading: This week's theme is "Teamwork". Students will build comprehension by evaluating author's purpose and determining how the author organized the writing to show the author's purpose while reading Teamwork and Help for Hank.

Spelling: This week's words focus on short /o/: top, hop, pot, got, lot. The high-frequency words are: teacher, has, know, grow, now. The sentence is: I got a top for the pot.

<u>High-Frequency Words:</u> Students will work towards mastery of learning the following words on sight: very, use, now, help.

Grammar: Students will review that sentences are a group of words in the correct order and make sense. Sentences begin with a capital letter and end with punctuation.

Centers: Completing work independently is crucial during this routine so the teacher can work with students in small groups. Students are encouraged to "Ask 3 Before Me" so each small group gets the attention they need to become better readers.

Handwriting: Students will learn correct formation of the following letters: Mm, Hh, Bb, and Ff.

Writer's Workshop: Students will work with a writing buddy to help each other edit/revise their small moment stories. Students listen, give a compliment and suggestion, and mark the spot for changes to fix later.

MATHEMATICS

The focus is on developing addition and subtraction strategies, particularly doubling, counting on, and counting back to solve combinations within 12. Students will work with a number rack and then learn games in which they add, subtract, and record their results on graphs. Students who are still counting by 1's to add and subtract are encouraged to count on and count back instead, and those who have moved beyond counting by 1's are encouraged to develop strategies that make use of well-known facts to solve less familiar combinations.





All students have different learning styles. Students have the opportunity to use different materials to practice spelling words each week. Some materials are play-doh, stencils, legoes, stamps, and a keyboard.
